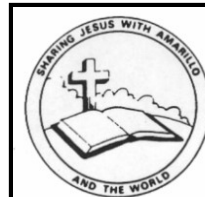

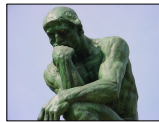

## Fathers, What is Your Legacy?

Inheritance is important. Good fathers desire to leave something behind for their children (Prov. 13:22). Old Testament law even regulated the passing down of a father's possessions (Deut. 21:15-17; Num. 27:8-11). As fathers, what sort of inheritance would we like to see our children get?

**Material Possessions.** There is nothing wrong with money, if possessed and used in godly ways. The Lord certainly wants us to provide for our families (1 Tim. 5:8). However, Paul also warned Timothy that the "love of money is a root of all kinds of evil" (1 Tim. 6:10), and Jesus tells us that we cannot serve two masters (Matt. 6:24). So while we certainly can be interested in provided a material inheritance for our children, we must also be aware that riches will grow wings (Prov. 23:5). Worldly possessions will rust, and are subject to the thievery of men (Matt. 6:20). A material inheritance can be good for our families, but isn't there something better?

**Eternal Possessions.** While fathers cannot literally pass down eternal life to their children, they can certainly influence their children towards it! We can store up treasures in heaven (Matt. 6:20), and in so doing set the right example for our children. Fathers are tasked with the responsibility of bringing up their children in the training and admonition of the Lord (Eph. 6:4). In so doing, we can pass down to our children a legacy of faith that could last them for eternity!

Fathers, it is good to provide for our family's physical well-being. But the greatest legacy you can leave your children is faith in God and a Christian example that will span the ages!

## THE KEY TO TRUE HAPPINESS



Psychologist Bernard Rimland once developed an interesting test you can use to determine what causes true happiness. Make a list of 10 people whom you know the best. After each name write either H (for happy) or N (for not happy). Then go down the list again, this time writing S (for selfish) and U (for unselfish) after each name. Once you have completed your list, you will notice something interesting. When Rimland added up the cases of 1,988 people rated by 216 students in 6 college classes, he found that the happy/selfish category had very few in it (only 78), while 827 fell into the happy/unselfish list.

Here's what we can deduce from this data: Selfish people are by definition devoted to bringing themselves happiness, but they rarely do. Unselfish people were deemed to live much more satisfying lives. Thus, the key to true happiness is spending your time making someone else happy. Jesus knew this, of course, for He is quoted by Paul as saying "it makes one happier to give than to get" (Acts 20:35, Williams). If you want to truly be happy, take Jesus' advice: "Treat other people exactly as you would like to be treated by them" (Matt. 7:12, Phillips).
